

CUTIE

collections
(16 Fat Eighths)



MATERIALS:

Cutie Pack	1
Background fabric	3 yards
Batting	65" x 83" piece
Backing	65" x 83" piece
Binding fabric	$\frac{5}{8}$ yard

CUTTING:

Note: Separate the cuties into 3 different piles and label them A, B, and C. Piles A and B will consist of 4 cuties each and pile C will consist of 8 cuties.

From the A pile: Cut each cutie into:

- (1) 8" square
- (1) $8\frac{3}{8}$ " square
- (2) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

From the B pile: Cut each cutie into:

- (2) $8\frac{3}{8}$ " squares

From the C pile: Cut each cutie into:

- (2) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 22" strips

From the background:

- Cut (1) 16" x WOF strip
- Subcut (1) $15\frac{1}{2}$ " square
- (4) 8" squares
- Cut (3) $8\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF strips
- Subcut (12) $8\frac{3}{8}$ " squares
- Cut (17) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips
- Subcut 8 strips in half crosswise to yield (16) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 21" strips
- Subcut 1 strip into (2) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

From the binding fabric:

- Cut (7) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips

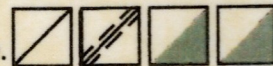

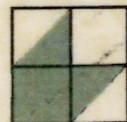
PIECING:

Half-square triangle (hst) units: Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (4) $8\frac{3}{8}$ " background squares. Place each marked square right sides together with an $8\frac{3}{8}$ " A cutie square.

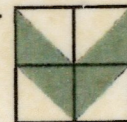


Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn lines, and cut apart on the lines. Open each unit and press the seams toward the cutie fabric to complete (8) 8" x 8" hst units.

Corner Blocks: Sew 2 identical hst units, 1 matching 8" A cutie square and an 8" background square together to complete one $15\frac{1}{2}$ " x $15\frac{1}{2}$ " corner block. Make 4 corner blocks.

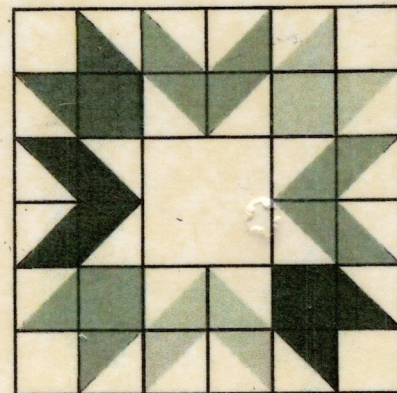


Side Blocks: Make 16 hst units using (8) $8\frac{3}{8}$ " B cutie squares. Sew the 4 identical hst units together to make one $15\frac{1}{2}$ " x $15\frac{1}{2}$ " block. Make 4 side blocks.



Sew the corner blocks, side blocks, and the $15\frac{1}{2}$ " background square together into three rows of three blocks each.

Press row seams in opposing directions, then sew the rows together to complete the $45\frac{1}{2}$ " x $45\frac{1}{2}$ " quilt center.

PIECING CONT:

Sew (8) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF background strips short ends together to make one long strip. Cut (4) $45\frac{1}{2}$ " lengths and (2) $69\frac{1}{2}$ " lengths.

Sew each $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 21" background strip lengthwise together with a C cutie strip to make a total of 16 strip sets. Press seams to the cutie strip. Crosscut (70) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " wide segments.

Border 1. Sew 15 segments together to make one strip. Press seams to one side. Sew a $45\frac{1}{2}$ " long background strip to each long side to make 1 border unit. Make a second border unit.

Noting orientation, sew these units to the top and bottom of the quilt center.

Border 2. Sew the $69\frac{1}{2}$ " background strips to each long side of the quilt top.

Border 3. Sew (11) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " wide segments and (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " background square together to make one long strip. Make a second strip. Sew to the long sides of the quilt top.

Sew (9) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " wide segments and (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " cutie square together to make one long strip. Make a second strip. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt top.

Finishing: Layer the quilt top, batting, and backing. Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Bind using the (7) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF binding strips (see Cutie Glossary for binding instructions).
